Childcare Supply, Demand and Shortage Data

There is no single data source that permits the adequate modeling of the supply and quality of child care. Nor is there a single source of data that indicates the demand for childcare services. And where demand data exist, it is inadequate because there is no clear indication of which children are in child care and which are not; which are in child care near where their parents live or near where they work. Because of this, Reinvestment Fund statistically estimated both the supply of and demand for child care by combining data from several different databases to best approximate both sides of the supply/demand equation.

The shortage in child care was measured generally in two ways: absolute and relative. The absolute shortage is the raw difference between supply and demand. The relative shortage is a measure that makes statistical adjustments for existing shortages in the market. Absolute and relative shortages were subdivided to offer specific gap measures for total supply, certified supply and high-quality supply (defined as centers with a Keystone STARS 3- or 4-star rating). Every census block group in the city of Philadelphia has multiple supply, demand and shortage measures. Each of the shortage measures is instructive of the nature of the required programmatic or investment activity (e.g., invest in getting existing uncertified supply certified, upgrading existing certified supply, creating new high-quality supply).
